Company Overview

ComEd is a unit of Chicago-based Exelon Corporation (NYSE: EXC), one of the nation's largest electric utilities with more than \$18 billion in annual revenues and a customer base of 5.4 million in northern Illinois and Pennsylvania.

ComEd and its nearly 5,700 employees are responsible for maintaining more than 70,000 miles of power lines that make up the electric transmission and distribution systems in northern Illinois. ComEd also provides customer operations for more than 3.8 million customers across the region, or 70 percent of the state's population.

With a corporate history dating to the early days of electric service in Chicago, ComEd has long been a responsible corporate citizen in northern Illinois. ComEd and its employees are actively involved in communities throughout the region and sponsor many civic and cultural organizations.

ComEd is committed to improving electric service reliability for its customers. Since 2001, ComEd has invested approximately \$9 billion to expand, upgrade, and maintain the reliability of its transmission and delivery systems. Since 2001, ComEd has reduced the frequency of customer interruptions by 20 percent. During that same time, the duration of those outages decreased by 3 percent.

ComEd's service territory comprises part of all of 25 counties. The territory is bordered by Iroquois County to the south (roughly Interstate 80), the Wisconsin border to the north, the Iowa to the west and the Indiana border to the east.
