



# 2022 Employee Engagement Highlights

- **52% of employees** participated in at least one of our community engagement programs.
- **6,319 employee volunteers** logged **126,529 service hours** and redeemed over **\$530,000** in Dollars for Doers rewards.
- Our colleagues personally donated over **\$5.8 million** through the Exelon Foundation Employee Giving Campaign and Matching Gifts programs. The Foundation matched a portion of the donations, resulting in over **\$11.6 million** going directly back into the communities we serve.



# Spotlight Focus Area: Building Exelon's Future Workforce




The Exelon Foundation STEM Academy is a free, week-long program for 10th and 11th grade girls in the northern Illinois, Philadelphia, and Baltimore/D.C. areas interested in STEM. Participants learn from women working in STEM and other leaders by exploring sustainability, energy efficiency, renewable energy and climate change, and connect with like-minded peers while working on a team-based energy challenge. Since its launch in 2018, 820 young women (80% students of color) have attended.



In 2021, Exelon and the Exelon Foundation, in partnership with NEED, made a commitment to expand the STEM Academy program to include a scholarship component for academy alumnae. The Exelon Foundation STEM Academy scholarship is need-based and covers all costs associated with tuition, room and board for four years for selected students pursuing degrees in engineering, IT, and business/finance, and supply-chain management.



In 2021, Exelon and the Exelon Foundation in partnership with UNCF, launched the HBCU (Historically Black Colleges and Universities) Corporate Scholars program. The HBCU Corporate scholarship provides students who reside in the home regions of Exelon's six utilities up to \$25,000 of need-based aid per year for four years. Like the STEM Academy, scholars are engineering, IT, and business/finance, and supply-chain management.



# Exelon Foundation STEM Academy Scholars

During Teegan’s summer internship with ComEd, she designed and developed a comprehensive plan to restore the Great Western Trail section of the Illinois Prairie Path, which ran beneath several miles of transmission lines, to a natural prairie. This opportunity impacted Teegan’s life by immersing her into a corporate environment where she was able to apply real-world professional skills. She built relationships and picked up knowledgeable advice through shadow opportunities which allowed her to put her own unique spin on the project and incorporate creative ideas into her work.
