Meet Gennifer

Gennifer Bracy, community connector for customer strategy & governance at PECO, organized a 2-part event for her department during the pandemic. First, volunteers put together PECO Care Packages at home and in the office for the Brewerytown Sharswood Community Civic Center. The package included hand sanitizer, mask, wipes, PECO reusable bag, light bulbs and more – putting together 250 care packages. Later, a group of volunteers participated in a Community Resource Day where they handed out the care packages along with a donation from the PECO Smart Ideas team to the community. This volunteer effort was in collaboration with Civic Center's community resource giveaways each Friday during the pandemic - provided food, hygiene products, and other resources to community members in need.

During Covid, the number of respite trips actually soared. With school and work being virtual, their normal "season" has been extended indefinitely. Families are getting away all throughout the year as work and school can be completed anywhere. These bags were a wonderful addition to the respite experience and making the families smile.
